School Meals and Milk at No Charge for All Children

(Eligibility Criteria: All children, including teenagers, through age 18, are eligible for free meals and milk)

Effective June 20, 2023 — Wonderful College Prep Academy Delano (2070 Veneto Street, Delano, CA 93215) and Wonderful College Prep Academy Lost Hills (14848 Lamberson Avenue, Lost Hills, CA 93249) will be serving program-compliant meals and milk at no charge to children, including teenagers through age 18, through July 27, 2023, under the Seamless Summer Option (SSO). These meals are available to all children 18 years of age and under regardless of whether they attend school.

For students participating in a summer program at a Wonderful College Prep Academy campus: (Monday-Thursday or on academic instruction days):

- **Wonderful College Prep Academy (Delano) – Summer School Enrollees: Breakfast and Lunch either in the classroom or in Harvest Hall**
- **Wonderful College Prep Academy (Lost Hills) – Summer School Enrollees: Breakfast and Lunch either in the classroom or in Harvest Hall**

For children in the community (including teenagers through age 18), WCPA will provide meals and milk on a first-come, first-served basis at the following locations (Monday-Thursday or on academic instruction days):

Breakfast 7:00am-8:00am

Lunch 10:00am-11:00am

Wonderful College Prep Academy Lost Hills – South Parking Lot –

Breakfast 7:00am-8:00am

Lunch 10:00am-11:00am

Meals and milk are available to all children 18 years of age and under, including WCPA and non-WCPA students. No meal program applications are needed.
